

Governing Body Meeting Tuesday, August 2, 2005 Statehouse Convention Center, Little Rock

1. The nonpublic school enrollment figures will be multiplied by 1.75 and taken from the school's report to ANSAA at the beginning of the year even year prior to the next classification cycle. Passed 178-30. Effective date is 2006-2008 classification cycle.

2. The largest 32 schools (Class AAAAA) shall be divided into two classifications of 16 schools each. The largest 16 schools will comprise the largest classification and the next 16 shall comprise the second largest classification. Passed 157-46. Effective date is 2006-2008 classification cycle.

3. To clarify the process of changing Class AAA and Class AA classification and to allow affected schools to discuss and vote on reclassification. Failed.

4. Schools shall only be admitted to a conference, district or region in team sports at the beginning of a classification cycle. Passed. Effective date is 2006-2008 classification cycle.

5. Football schools will remain in the same classification for the sports of basketball, baseball, softball and track. Passed. Effective date is 2006-2008 school year.

6. A student transferring from a public to a nonpublic school after the beginning of their ninth grade year is ineligible for one calendar year. Failed.

7. A student transferring from a public to a nonpublic school after the beginning of their seventh grade year is ineligible for one calendar year. Failed.

8. To allow student golfers to participate in pro-am tournaments where scores are combined as permitted in the amateur rules of the USGA. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.

9. To allow a 9th grade student who has not competed on a senior high varsity team to begin non-school competition at the completion of their season. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.

10. Beginning with game two of the Class AAAAA playoffs, the team with the higher conference finish will be the home team in the second and third rounds. If two teams have the same conference finish, the team at the top of the bracket will be the home team. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.

11. Single round-robin tournaments of four or fewer teams are permissible if there is a method of selecting a champion. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.

12. One regular scheduled game may be played during the week of a guaranteed 3-game tournament. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.

13. To allow Class AAAAA girls golf to have up to five players with the three lowest scores determining the team score for conference, regional and state tournaments. Passed. Effective date is 2005-2006 school year.
